Today, the focus on the sunny colors and bright hues of Marigolds is on optimism and prosperity. Traditionally associated with rememberance and grief for the departed, the sunny colors of the marigold represented the sunlit paths that guide the departed loved ones. The bright yellow and orange also represented the beauty and warmth of the rising sun and its power to resurrect.

The Cosmos is a symbol of order, peace, and serenity. From the Greek word for order, harmony, and the world, Mission priests in Mexico gave the flower its name because of the evenly spaced petals. In addition to the order and harmony expressed in the blossom's symmetry, grace, and simplicity, it is re-emphasized in the symmetrically balanced, regularly doubled production of leaf and blossom stems.

Membership Renewal

It is the time of year to think about renewing your club membership for the upcoming year 2024. Remember, to be included in the next yearbook's list of members, you will need to send in an online or printed application and pay your dues by December 1st.

You can access the membership form from www.wildflowergardenclub.org under the membership tab. To mail a renewal, print a copy of the form and send it in with a check.

The annual membership cost is \$20 for an individual with an additional \$15 for each immediate family member (only one yearbook will be shared in a family membership).

You can also fill in the form online and pay electronically. **An additional cost of \$1 per member registration** will be applied to cover the processing fees of the credit card company.

We like to recognize members' birthday months in the newsletter, so there is also a spot on the membership form to include that information. Month—not year! If sharing birthday information is an issue for you, you may always write n/a in that spot on the form.

Club Business

Proposed Constitution, Bylaws & Standing Rules Amendments

We have an important announcement regarding the voting procedures for the elections of the 2024 Board of Directors as well as the approval of the proposed amendments to the Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules.

Normally, any proposed amendments to the Constitution, Bylaws, and Standing Rules are presented and voted on at a different time than the Board elections. This year, we were unable to make the separation. As one of the proposed amendments has to do with the terms of office, we have decided to do the amendment vote first and follow it immediately with the Board elections.

Upon much discussion, the members of the Board of Directors have concluded that the term of office of one year does not encompass enough time to learn a new position and to allow the most informed of decisions and policy making. We feel that a two-year term would be more beneficial to the Board members and better prepare them to be their best at their duties. So part of the proposed changes would extend the term of office from one year to two years. This change would align with the procedure for numerous other area garden clubs.

Votes will occur by your response (**do NOT use REPLY ALL**) to the email sent out from akwildflowers@gmail.com – **not using REPLY ALL** will ensure privacy for your vote. You may also just send a separate email if you would prefer not to use the REPLY function.

OCT 12: Board of Directors presents proposed Constitution, Bylaws & Standing Rules Amendments as approved by Board on Oct. 5, 2023 at the monthly meeting and emails information to all members to meet the required Official Club Notification timeframe.

Any questions must be asked before start of voting.

NOV 9-12: Voting opens <u>Thursday</u>, <u>Nov. 9th until Sunday</u>, <u>Nov. 12th at 5pm</u> seeking the approval of amendment revisions through the use of **electronic communication only** and via email to the Wildflower Garden Club of Alaska at <u>akwildflowers@gmail.com</u>
