The locals told me it is a "year for the nuts" because the acorn, pecan, walnut trees are all full. My mom has eight pecan trees, four of which had a bounty of nuts, four of which just gave us some. Nine and a half 5-gallon buckets were filled with pecans before I left, and yet the treetops are still full! The deer helped themselves to a few pecans on our drying rack before I noticed and quickly put them out of their reach. I was also told that pecans will all fall once there is a frost. No frost yet, but lots of wind. Thankfully, my dad invested in an electric pecan cracker, and I can tell you it saved the day! 130 cups of pecans were shared with family/friends or frozen, one cracked bucket went to family members, and two and a half buckets were left for my sister to crack. It had me thinking about my apple trees here in Alaska and how full they were. Maybe it was just a year of abundance. Hopefully, your gardens were bountiful and plenty as well and you were able to save some for the long winter months ahead.

Special wildflowers that bloomed this month

The November Birth flowers are the Chrysanthemum and the Peony.

The chrysanthemum is traditionally the official birth flower for November, known for blooming in the fall. They symbolize joy, longevity, and loyalty, and come in a wide variety of colors. Different chrysanthemum colors have different meanings, but include love, passion, happiness, hope, honesty, loyalty, truth, thoughtfulness, care, friendship, affection, good luck, renewal and health. These flowers represent positivity, care and sunniness, much like the people born in November.



In traditional Asian art, chrysanthemums are prized for their vibrant and delicate petals, symbolizing the sun's rays. Chinese and Japanese cultures associate these flowers with abundance, fulfillment, and intellectual achievements. They also represent inner beauty, humility, tolerance, and the tenacity to overcome adversity. The flowers are considered edible in many

cultures, and are used for tea in Asia.



The Peony is the secondary November birth flower. Like the peony, November people are generous, strong, and compassionate, with a natural ability to thrive even in difficult conditions, and may have an innate ability to help others heal emotionally, reflecting their empathy and kindness. Other traits are compassion, romantic feelings, and positive thoughts. In Japan, peonies symbolize honor and fortune. The peony has been prized for its medicinal properties for humans, but can be mildly to moderately toxic if ingested by pets.
